To Whom It May Concern:

Students registered in the Early Learning and Child Care certificate program have a practicum component that is for credit, and is integral to completion of their program of study. The practicum does not exceed more than 50% of the total program of study.

As part of the program, students must complete a total of 2 work terms. These terms require a total number of 350 hours. Each work term will be completed in the fall and winter semesters consisting of 5 weeks each. Students are scheduled to complete the certificate program at the end of their winter semester.

Duties may include, but are not limited to, positive interactions with children, providing extending play opportunities to enhance children's development.

We are asking that a co-op work permit be granted to the applicant, registered in our program, in order to fulfill program requirements as outlined in our academic calendar.
