#### PROGRAM NOTES:

- Medicine Hat College offers the **first year** of the Lethbridge College's Environmental Science diploma programs in Renewable Resource Management, Environmental Assessment and Restoration, and Natural Resource Compliance.
- The second year is completed at Lethbridge College.
- Students must apply to transfer to Lethbridge College from Medicine Hat College.**
- Employers may require you to hold a valid Standard First Aid or Wilderness First Aid certificate and/or a CPR certificate to be eligible for seasonal and/or permanent employment. You are encouraged to obtain these certificates either prior to entering the program or during the first term. A Police Information Check may be required to compete for jobs as Conservation Enforcement Officers in Canada.
- BIOL 254, BIOL 255, and BIOL 259 have required field components. Should you enroll in these courses, you will be expected to provide your own equipment and supplies. This may include a sleeping tent, warm sleeping bag, sleeping mat, backpack, adequate clothing for cold/wet weather, hiking boots, cooking and eating utensils, binoculars, food, field notebook, compass and hip or chest waders.
- In the second year during the months of September and April, you will be off the Lethbridge College campus completing field courses. It is therefore extremely difficult to take Year 1 and Year 2 courses at the same time. You are advised to complete all Year 1 courses before proceeding to Year 2.
- Many courses require computer competency to complete assignments. You are advised to enroll in MICO 191 if you lack these skills.
