Important Online SLPA Program Information:

The SLPA diploma, when completed online, takes a longer period of time than taking the program onsite. It takes typically 3 to 5 years to complete the program online. Students are discouraged from taking more than three classes per semester. Each student must contact the academic advisor to develop a customized plan of study based on individual needs before registering in any classes. Program plans will not be discussed with the advisor until all transfer credit and other required documentation is completed.

Continuation Requirements:

- Students must adhere to the professional commitment as outlined in the Therapist Assistant Programs Student Handbook. Failure to do so may result in dismissal from the program.
- Students must complete the program within three years of completion of SLPA 212.
- All SLPA, TAPC, KNES, LING, AUDA, and IDST courses must be completed with grades of C or better.
- Students must earn a grade of at least C- in all other courses.
- In order to continue in the program, a current and cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 is required at the end of each semester.
- Completion and attendance of AUDA 212 is mandatory.
- Students will usually be permitted to repeat a particular SLPA program course (TAPC, SLPA, and AUDA) only once.
- Students are normally expected to complete courses in the sequence outlined in the calendar. Courses taken in a sequence other than what is outlined in the calendar [including deferring courses into other terms] may compromise your standing in the program. This also facilitates proper planning for labs and fieldwork.
